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**Work Session, Douglas City Council  
April 8, 2021**

A Work Session of the Douglas City Council was held on April 8, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 101 N. 4<sup>th</sup> Street, Douglas, Wyoming.

**Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, Roll Call; those present on Roll Call:** Mayor René Kemper, Councilperson Kim Pexton, Councilperson Ron McNare, Councilperson Monty Gilbreath; Councilperson John Bartling was absent.

**Also Present:** Jonathan Teichert, City Administrator; Chaz Schumacher, City Clerk; Todd Byerly, PD Chief; John Harbarger, Director of Public Works.

**Discussion Regarding Signage:** Mayor Kemper inquired into what avenues the City has for addressing signage in the community that might contain profanity or hate speech. Chief Byerly explained that he has been working with Administrator Teichert to see what avenues the City would have for addressing signage, there really isn't an avenue for addressing signage based on the contents alone, unless it contains sexually explicit material. Discussion followed. **Agenda Review – Regular City Council Meeting: April 12, 2021:** Administrator Teichert reviewed the agenda for upcoming City Council meeting, noting there will be 3 items included that were previously tabled and those are in regards to changes in rates; there is a bid recommendation for the Douglas Parkway Irrigation, Teichert explained the recommendation includes an option to do additional work. Discussion followed. Councilperson McNare noted edits to be made to Resolution No. 2077 regarding the utility rate structure. Discussion followed. Administrator's Update: Administrator Teichert provided the Council with updates on current projects and happenings at the City. Councilperson Pexton stated she has received complaints about a underdressed skater at Bartling Park, Chief Byerly will make his department aware of it, he has added extra patrols in the area during the summer months. Councilperson McNare asked about the status of the Sheep Mountain Well and discussions with the property owners, discussion followed. Director of Public Works Harbarger informed the Council we have received an estimate for the Pearson Road project and it's \$3.5 million, discussion followed. Councilperson McNare stated he will share a letter with the Council from the WYDOT director regarding re-naming Yellowstone Bridge, discussion followed. **Adjourn – No further discussion and the Work Session was adjourned at approximately 6:43 p.m. No Council Action was taken.**
